Spirituality, Service & Social Change Fellows have a nine-week, fulltime summer experience working at organizations guided by religious or spiritual convictions. Fellows may work in arenas such as health care, education, human rights, environmental justice, hunger and homelessness, youth empowerment, immigrant rights, and affordable housing.

Once fellows are selected, ORL and UCCM staff assists students in finding placements with Bay Area organizations. These organizations are inclusive, non-proselytizing and non-partisan.

Prior to your interview, please take some time to think about your service interests and skills and to explore the websites of the following organizations. Be prepared to tell the selection committee which organizations appeal to you as potential placements and why. Applicants may also bring information about organizations that they have found on their own. Preference will not be given to those students who use the list; however, those who do not will eventually need to effectively demonstrate that their intended placements are inclusive, non-proselytizing and non-partisan agencies where they will receive adequate guidance and supervision. Self-proposed placements are subject to final approval in the spring by Spirituality, Service & Social Change Fellowship staff.
