

2006 Community Service Work-Study Summer Public Service Program

Potential Funds for Summer Service Experiences!

The Community Service Work-Study Summer Program provides an opportunity for students to develop and participate in a significant summer service experience, while earning a portion of their financial aid award. The goal of this program is to provide students with a meaningful summer service and learning experience relevant to their interests and geographical preference, while supporting and enhancing the work of non-profit and governmental organizations.

During the summer program, students can earn up to \$4,400, at a rate of \$11.00 per hour, and can work with an appropriate organization anywhere within the United States. This program provides the freedom for eligible students to design a service experience in collaboration with a partnering organization.
